PRIVATE SECTOR CONSULTATION MEETING ON THE 2024
PLATEAU STATE BUSINESS ENABLING REFORMS ACTION PLAN
HELD ON DECEMBER 10TH, 2024 AT THE BANQUET HALL, NEW
GOVERNMENT HOUSE LITTLE RAYFIELD JOS,
PLATEAU STATE.

1.0 ATTENDANCE

2.0. OPENING

The Private Sector Consultation Meeting commenced at 5:00 PM. The high-level event was attended by the Executive Governor of Plateau State, His Excellency Barr. Caleb Mutfwang, alongside his team, representatives from over 20 large businesses, potential investors, and delegates from 50 Business Management Organizations (BMOs).

The key objective of the dialogue was for the State Governor and his team to recognize the resilience of the business community, despite the challenging economic conditions, and to engage directly with them by listening to their Business Enabling Environment (BEE) challenges. Together, they aimed to jointly develop sustainable solutions. Relevant Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs) involved in the BEE participated in a panel discussion, where they shared insights on existing reforms and presented plans for favorable reforms to be developed and implemented in 2025.

3.0. WELCOME REMARK

The Managing Director/CEO of PIPC Ltd welcomed members to the meeting, explaining that it was convened specifically to address the following objectives:

- a. To acknowledge the resilience and tenacity of the business community, who have shown remarkable survival skills despite the challenging economic environment.
- b. To provide a platform for direct interaction between the government and the business community, enabling the government to listen attentively to

- the challenges and concerns of businesses. This exchange is aimed at creating the foundation for sustainable solutions and impactful reforms.
- c. To highlight the State Government's commitment to improving the Business Enabling Environment (BEE), and to outline specific measures and initiatives that reflect this dedication.

He further explained the structure of the event, which was designed to ensure a robust and meaningful dialogue. The event was divided into three main sessions:

- **Panel Discussion:** A distinguished panel of representatives from key government MDAs will address critical reforms needed to tackle the challenges of the business environment.
- **Business Community Presentations:** This session allows selected representatives from the business community to present their experiences, challenges, and proposals, ensuring the government's interventions align with the realities of the sector.
- The Executive Governor's Remarks: The evening will conclude with remarks from the Executive Governor, Barr. Caleb M. Mutfwang, the Chief Investment Officer of the State. His Excellency's words will provide guidance and reaffirm the government's commitment to fostering a thriving business environment in Plateau State. The MD/CEO declared the event open.

4.0 GOODWILL MESSAGE

a. PLACCIMA Representative:

In his goodwill message, the representative from PLACCIMA expressed appreciation to the Plateau State Government for its ongoing efforts to support businesses in the state. He highlighted the various forms of support PLACCIMA has received from the state government, which have significantly contributed to business growth. One notable initiative mentioned was the State Trade Fair, scheduled for March 2025, which will serve as a platform for businesses to access new markets and expand their networks. The representative assured the state government of PLACCIMA's continued support and urged the government to ensure that key reforms are effectively implemented.

b. GIZ/SEDIN Representative:

The GIZ/SEDIN representative focused on several important development efforts in Plateau State, particularly those that involve partnerships, challenges, and opportunities. He acknowledged the significant contributions of the Plateau State Government, especially the Secretary to the State Government, in various economic and social interventions. The speaker also emphasized the

importance of collaboration with organizations such as PIPC, PS-OSIC, and PLASMIDA, recognizing their roles in supporting businesses and driving development in the state. Additionally, he provided an overview of GIZ's activities and contributions in Plateau State over the past 15 years, highlighting various initiatives that have benefitted both the government and private sectors.

c. Ag. Head PS-OSIC:

The Acting Head of PS-OSIC encouraged businesses to take advantage of the ongoing Federal Government's N75 billion intervention program, administered through the Bank of Industry (BOI). MSMEs can access up to N5 million through this initiative. The Acting Head emphasized the need to raise awareness about this program across all 17 Local Government Areas (LGAs) in the state in the coming year, ensuring that more businesses are informed and able to benefit from the program.

5.0 PRESENTATION ON PLATEAU STATE BEE BY THE SGS/CHAIRMAN, EASE OF DOING BUSINESS COUNCIL:

The Chairman expressed delight at the significant trust and confidence Plateau State has garnered from investors within the first few months of the current administration. He shared that available data reveals Plateau State's GDP has seen positive trends, with contributions from key sectors such as agriculture, mining, trade, manufacturing, and tourism.

He further explained that MSMEs play a dominant role in these sectors, making a substantial contribution to the state's GDP and employing over 70% of the workforce, particularly women and youth. The Secretary emphasized that the government has implemented several reforms aimed at improving the business environment. These reforms include infrastructure development, energy reforms, financial support through the Plateau MSME Support Fund, and capacity-building programs.

Despite these efforts, the Secretary noted that achieving economic transformation requires the active participation of the private sector, development partners, and civil society. He encouraged businesses to invest in priority areas such as renewable energy, agro-processing, and digital technology. Public-private partnerships were also highlighted as key to advancing the state's development, and businesses were urged to provide feedback to help shape effective policies.

The Secretary also acknowledged Plateau State's diverse sectors, including agriculture, trade, manufacturing, tourism, and mining, which collectively

contribute significantly to both GDP and employment. However, he pointed out that economic growth in 2023 was below the national average. This underlined the need to address challenges such as access to finance, infrastructure, taxation, electricity, security, and inflation to drive sustainable growth.

6.0 NEW BUSINESS IDEAS

6.1. 2024 PLATEAU STATE BUSINESS ENABLING REFORM ACTION PLAN - MDAs

A panel of ten (10) members shared insights on government policies aimed at enhancing the State's Business Enabling Environment (BEE). The focus was on sustainable reforms and government initiatives to foster growth. The panel covered key sectors such as investment promotion and facilitation, investment development and management, tax reforms, transportation, agriculture, mining, energy, MSME development, gender inclusion, legal reforms, and environmental reforms.

COMMENTS:

The panelists highlighted some of the government reforms and the multiple MoUs and Heads of Terms with key investors through Public-Private Partnership (PPP) arrangements. They mentioned that some of these agreements have already created investment-ready opportunities, while others are still works in progress.

They emphasized that, while these reforms are strengthening the economy, they recognize the short-term challenges they may cause, including business closures or reduced operations. The government empathizes deeply with businesses affected by these changes. It was also noted that the current approach to project development reflects foresight and preparation, positioning Plateau State to unlock untapped investments.

6.2. 2024 PLATEAU STATE BUSINESS ENABLING REFORM ACTION PLAN – PRIVATE SECTOR

The business community presented several key challenges, including:

- Access to finance
- Infrastructure
- Market access
- Low patronage of locally made products
- Multiple taxation
- Inadequate shared facilities for clusters

They also proposed sustainable solutions for further development and implementation.

COMMENTS:

On the proposed solutions, the business community provided several suggestions to address their challenges, including:

- Access to Finance: Available sources of finance should be made known to MSMEs through sensitization and awareness campaigns by relevant organizations. A fund with waivers on loan requirements should be established, alongside financial literacy training. Collaboration with partner organizations offering financial literacy should be strengthened, with the support of the government and other institutions, to reach a wider audience.
- **Energy Solutions**: A multi-dimensional approach to energy solutions should be adopted, including engaging with NESCO and considering an increase in their stake/ownership. Renewable energy options, such as mini-grids, should be explored, and energy policies should be reviewed to integrate green energy sources.
- Shared Facilities & Market Access: The establishment of shared facilities for clusters in designated locations should be prioritized. Improvements in existing physical markets, such as the addition of toilets, and the establishment of new markets should be considered. An e-commerce strategy should be implemented to enhance market access. Periodic trade fairs can be organized to showcase locally made Plateau products, creating linkages and generating income for both the government and the private sector.

6.3. 2024 PLATEAU STATE BUSINESS ENABLING REFORM ACTION PLAN – HIS EXCELLENCY CALEB MANASSEH. MUTFWANG

The Governor, in his closing remarks, outlined strategic initiatives being implemented to harness the state's economic potential and improve the business environment. He emphasized the government's commitment to ongoing dialogue with stakeholders to bring about sustainable change in the business environment.

COMMENTS:

The Executive Governor outlined key initiatives aimed at revitalizing the state's economy, including:

- Proactive steps in promoting local content by engaging indigenous contractors for state projects.
- Support for MSMEs in accessing finance, with ongoing partnerships on the matching fund with the Bank of Industry and other financial institutions to ensure easy access to finance. Transitioning to renewable energy through the "Light Up Plateau" project.
- Revitalizing the tourism sector, with upgrades to the Hill Station and Plateau Hotel.
- Modernizing the agriculture and mining sectors, as the backbone of the state's economy.
- Strengthening the logistics arm of the transport sector and subsidizing transportation through effective implementation of conditional cash transfers to ensure citizens retain more.
- Continuous collaboration with international partners, such as GIZ/SEDIN, to expand and structure business activities while ensuring an investor-friendly environment.

7.0 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

It was suggested that the momentum generated by this event should be sustained through continued dialogue and actionable outcomes. By prioritizing the recommendations discussed and fostering partnerships between the public and private sectors, Plateau State can position itself as a leading destination for investment in Nigeria. The collective efforts of all stakeholders will be crucial in driving economic development, creating jobs, and improving the overall quality of life for residents in the region.

8.0 CLOSING REMARKS

The Director General of PLASMIDA gave the closing remarks, providing an overview of the next steps. He reiterated the government's commitment to implementing the reforms before the next dialogue with His Excellency.

9.0 ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned by the Executive Secretary of VAN, with the motion seconded by Mr. Solomon Wadak.

10.0 CLOSING

The dialogue meeting over dinner was brought to a close at 10:45 PM.
