

### REPORT OF THE STAKEHOLDERS WORKSHOP ON THE 2025 STATE BUSINESS ENABLING REFORM ACTION PLAN (BERAP)

### 1.0 Introduction

The Stakeholders Workshop on the 2025 State Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) was organized as part of Plateau State's continued efforts to enhance the business environment, promoting economic growth and development. The workshop, attended by 70 participants, including representatives from government agencies, development partners, community leaders, private sector stakeholders, and other key actors, was convened to review the progress made under the State Action on Business Enabling Reforms (SABER) framework. This event provided a collaborative platform for discussing the successes and challenges faced in 2024, as well as charting the course for the coming year.

The event was chaired by the Deputy Governor of Plateau State, who was represented by the Secretary to the Government of the State, who is also the Chairman of the State Ease of Doing Business Council (EoDBC). He reinforced the importance of the State Government's commitment to driving forward reforms and creating an environment that is conducive to business growth. The Secretary to the Government highlighted the state's resolve to prioritize business reforms and continue fostering public-private partnerships that will ensure sustained economic progress.

At the heart of this workshop was Plateau State's ambition to position itself as one of the top states in Nigeria for ease of doing business. This goal is part of the broader vision to create a more conducive environment for private sector growth, job creation, and sustainable development. As noted in Engr. Samari Modibo, the SABER Champion for Plateau State's opening remark, while outlining this ambition, He emphasized the unwavering commitment of the Plateau State Government to prioritize and accelerate the implementation of key business reforms that will boost investor confidence and improve the overall competitiveness of the state.

Throughout the workshop, participants engaged in constructive discussions aimed at evaluating the current business environment, identifying bottlenecks, and proposing actionable solutions to address these issues. By involving a diverse range of stakeholders, including government officials, private sector representatives, and development partners, the workshop highlighted the collaborative nature of business reforms. It also highlighted the importance of aligning the State's

reforms with national policies and global best practices to create an environment that attracts both local and foreign investment.

The ultimate aim of the workshop was not only to assess the progress of the 2024 reforms but also to develop a comprehensive and realistic action plan for 2025. This action plan will serve as a roadmap for continued progress, ensuring that Plateau State remains on track to achieve its goal of becoming one of the leading states in Nigeria in terms of business enablement and ease of doing business.

### 2.0 Welcome Address

The workshop commenced with a welcome address delivered by the Chairman of the State Ease of Doing Business Council and Secretary to the Government of the State, Arc. Samuel N. Jatau. In his address, Arc. Jatau noted the importance of creating a more business-friendly environment in Plateau State. He emphasized that such an environment is vital for stimulating private sector investment, fostering entrepreneurship, and ultimately contributing to the economic growth and development of the state. Arc. Jatau commended all stakeholders' active participation and dedication, acknowledging their continuous efforts and commitment to driving meaningful reforms. He expressed confidence that Plateau State would make significant strides in its business reform agenda with the ongoing collaboration among government, private sector, and development partners.

### 3.0 Keynote Address

The keynote address was delivered by Her Excellency Ngo Josephine Piyo, the Deputy Governor of Plateau State, represented by the Secretary to the Government of the state who emphasized the State Government's focus on creating an environment conducive to investment and entrepreneurship. The Deputy Governor's address highlighted the critical role that a robust business environment plays in ensuring the long-term prosperity of the state. She acknowledged Plateau State's current ranking of ten out of 36 states and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) in terms of ease of doing business, which, according to her, is a commendable achievement. However, she emphasized that Plateau State is not resting on its laurels. The state aspires to surpass this position and continue improving its standing in the coming years. Her Excellency's speech reiterated the government's

unwavering commitment to the business reforms and actions that will continue to make Plateau State a prime destination for both local and international investors.

### 4.0 Opening Remarks and Objectives

The opening remarks and objectives of the workshop were presented by Engr. Samari Modibo, the State SABER Reform Champion. In his address, Engr. Modibo provided a detailed overview of Plateau State's progress in implementing business reforms under the State Action on Business Enabling Reforms (SABER) framework. He celebrated the achievements made in 2024, particularly the improvements in the regulatory environment and ease of doing business in the state. At the same time, he acknowledged that there are areas where further efforts are needed. Engr. Modibo stressed the importance of consolidating the gains made in 2024, ensuring that the reforms are deepened and sustained over time. He set the stage for the collaborative development of an action plan for 2025, encouraging all stakeholders to contribute to the development of ambitious goals that would continue to drive Plateau State toward its objective of becoming one of the top ten states in Nigeria for ease of doing business.

### 5.0 Sessions Overview

The Stakeholders Workshop on the 2025 State Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) featured informative and collaborative sessions designed to engage stakeholders in identifying key challenges, evaluating proposed reforms, and developing a comprehensive action plan for the upcoming year. Each session was led by experts in the field, offering valuable insights into Plateau State's business environment and the necessary steps to enhance its ease of doing business.

### Session 1: Current Business Landscape and Challenges in Plateau State

The first session, led by Dr. Paul Adepelumi, provided an in-depth analysis of the current business landscape in Plateau State. Dr. Adepelumi's presentation focused on the recent positive reforms implemented in the state and the persistent challenges that still hinder business growth. These challenges included regulatory inefficiencies that slow down business operations, limited infrastructure that affects connectivity and accessibility, and difficulties in accessing finance, particularly for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). By laying out these issues, the session set the stage for discussing potential solutions and reforms in subsequent sessions, ensuring that

participants understood the existing barriers to business growth and could contribute meaningfully to discussions on addressing them.

### Session 2: Presentation of the 2025 Draft BERAP

Dr. Paul Adepelumi presented the 2025 Draft Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) in the second session. This session highlighted the key reforms proposed for the coming year, focusing on practical steps to enhance the business environment. Some of the key reforms included improvements in licensing and tax administration to simplify processes for businesses, streamlining land acquisition procedures to make it easier for investors to acquire property, and enhancing access to finance and technological infrastructure to support business expansion. Additionally, investment promotion strategies and mechanisms for the swift resolution of commercial disputes were introduced as crucial components of the reform plan. Dr. Adepelumi also drew from best practices implemented by other states that had successfully improved their business climates, providing valuable inspiration for Plateau State's reform trajectory.

### Session 3: Private Sector Perspective on Enabling Business Reforms

In the third session, Dr Adepelumi guided the participants through an open discussion. The discussion focused on identifying the key priorities of the private sector and addressing the barriers that hinder business operations in Plateau State. A recurring theme throughout the discussion was the call for greater transparency in regulatory processes, more efficient and predictable regulations, and better infrastructure to support business growth. The private sector representatives stressed that improving these areas would make a significant difference in facilitating investment, increasing productivity, and fostering a more dynamic business environment.

### Session 4: Action Plan Development Workshop

This session of the workshop focused on the collaborative development of the 2025 Action Plan for business reforms. Participants engaged in group discussions, identifying key priorities, setting realistic goals, and defining the roles of various stakeholders in implementing the reforms. The session fostered a sense of shared responsibility and collective ownership of the reform agenda, ensuring that all parties would be actively involved in achieving the state's business environment goals. By the end of the session, the framework for the 2025 State Business Enabling Reform Action

Plan was solidified, with clear actions outlined to further strengthen Plateau State's position as a leading destination for business and investment.

### Session 5: Action Plan Development Workshop - Group Sessions

This session, led by Dr. Adepelumi and Engr. Modibo, was structured as an engaging and interactive breakout session. Participants were divided into groups and tasked with proposing actionable steps for improving Plateau State's business environment across various focus areas. The groups worked collaboratively, brainstorming and debating strategies aimed at streamlining regulatory processes, reducing administrative burdens, and enhancing transparency in governance. These focus areas were critical in addressing the main challenges identified earlier in the workshop.

Each group was tasked with defining immediate, medium-term, and long-term priorities for action. This approach ensured that the proposed reforms were realistic, actionable, and aligned with the state's strategic goals. The outputs of the session included specific reform recommendations tailored to the state's unique needs, which were categorized based on their timeframes and impact. By the end of the session, each group had outlined concrete steps that would contribute to achieving the overarching goals of the State Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP).

### Session 6: Reporting and Next Steps

In the final session of the workshop, each group presented its proposed action points, highlighting the key reforms identified during the breakout sessions. These proposals were discussed in detail, and responsibilities were assigned to the relevant stakeholders to ensure that the reforms would be effectively implemented. The emphasis in this session was on consolidating feedback from all groups into a unified, comprehensive reform plan for Plateau State.

### 6.0 Next Steps

The next steps involve:

1. Finalize and disseminate the 2025 BERAP document to the State Executive Council for review, adoption, and subsequent approval.

2. Regular quarterly progress reviews to track the implementation of the reform plan. These reviews will provide opportunities for adjustments, ensuring that the goals are met within the established timeframes.

### 7.0 Closing Remarks

At the end of the workshop, Dr. Paul provided a comprehensive summary of the key takeaways and commitments made throughout the event. His remarks captured the main discussions, achievements, and action points outlined during the workshop, reinforcing the collective commitment to Plateau State's business reforms. He emphasized the importance of continued collaboration between the public and private sectors, acknowledging that the success of the 2025 Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) would depend on the active participation and mutual support of all stakeholders involved.

Dr. Paul also highlighted that the partnership between the government, private sector, and other key actors must remain robust and result-oriented. It was vital that all parties, from government agencies to private businesses and civil society, stay committed to the goals agreed upon during the workshop and work together to overcome challenges and seize opportunities for improvement. This commitment would be the driving force behind Plateau State's aspiration to move up on the ease of doing business rankings and create a more favorable environment for investment and entrepreneurship.

Ms. Dorothy Payi (SRDO) delivered the closing remarks. She expressed gratitude to all participants for their dedication and contributions, which had shaped the workshop into a productive and insightful event. She reiterated the importance of remaining focused on the action points agreed upon and following through on the commitments made. As the workshop concluded, there was a sense of optimism and shared purpose among all participants, with a clear understanding that the work ahead would require continued effort, collaboration, and accountability to achieve the desired reforms.

With the foundation laid for the 2025 BERAP and the actions identified, the workshop ended on a note of confidence and readiness to tackle the challenges ahead, ensuring that Plateau State remains on track to becoming a leading destination for business and investment in Nigeria.
