6.0 **Presentation of Memo No. PLM 011/2024 On The Plateau State Business Enabling Reform (SABER): 2025 State Business Enabling Reform Action Pan (BERAP).**

6.1. **The Hon. Commissioner of Finance in her presentation informed Council that the Plateau State Government adopted the implementation of the State Action on Business Enabling Reform (SABER) Program, a 3-year initiative of the Federal Government through the Federal Ministry of Finance and the Presidential Enabling Business Environment Council (PEBEC), in collaboration with the World Bank to incentivize and strengthen the implementation of business-enabling reforms across Nigeria with emphasis on the private sector development which remains the major vehicle to create more jobs, increase revenues to states and improve social and economic outcomes for citizens.**

**She further stated that:**

1. **One amongst the other Eligibility Criteria (EC) to qualify the State to participate in the 2025**

**SABER program for Results (PforR) was the need for Council to consider and approve the 2025 Plateau State Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) before 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024;**

2. **The 2025 State Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) was prepared in consultation with relevant stakeholders through a 1-day workshop, attended by more than 50 participants, including representatives from government agencies, development partners, community leaders, private sector stakeholders, and other key actors, where constructive discussions aimed at evaluating the current business environment, identifying bottlenecks and proposing actionable solutions to address these issues was carried out.**

**She therefore requested Council to:**

**A. NOTE:**

- i. **That the 2025 Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) is one of the Eligibility Criteria that will qualify the State to participate in the 2025 SABER Program for results (P for R)**
- ii. **The deadline for its upload on the Plateau State Official Website must be on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024.**

**B. APPROVE:**

**To consider and approve the 2025 BERAP and direct the Plateau State Information and Communication Technology and Development Agency (PICTDA) to upload same on the State's**

**Official Websites ahead of the 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024 deadline.**
